



Mentally Healthy Schools Team

At RFPS, we work very closely with the Mentally Healthy Schools Team throughout the year. They support individuals and also us as a whole school to improve our provision for children who are showing early signs of mental health difficulties. These could be anxieties and worries, low mood, or also early onset of some fears or phobias.

As part of our whole school work, we do an annual audit of our provision. Part of this is a parent/carer questionnaire, the results of which will help us to plan parent and carer sessions to support you to support your children, as well as our universal provision for all children in school. It is really valuable for us to collect as much data as possible, even if you feel that this is a service which your family does not currently need support from, as it can help us to understand our pupils as a whole group.
