Their endeavour to make a longhouse similar to those traditionally used by the Iroquois tribe was commendable! Well done Year 4!

## What is an Inspire Workshop?

Below you will see dates for Inspire Workshops for KS2 children (KS1 will be in the Spring term). They are a chance for parents/carers/family members to come and work with their child on lots of relevant learning activities, which have been planned and organised by their class teachers. They are usually based in the hall and approximately 1 hour long. We really hope you can join us!

## School trips and residential

The last two academic years have been severely affected by Covid19 in so many different ways but the thing that the children seem to have missed the most is trips, visits and residential. Lots of parents are asking about these and we are very busy behind the scenes booking them but trying to get the best possible prices and locations for our pupils.

It has always been our plan to offer at least two residential visits in Year 4 and Year 6. Year 4 to have 2 nights/3 days away and Year 6 to have 4 nights/5 days away. This is fairly usual practice in the majority of primary schools to offer two trips (some schools offer more than this). We want to balance children's experiences with cost to parents. This is why we offer them two years apart so there is some time between them. Obviously, if you have children two years apart or twins this can mean that the cost is all at one time which we know is difficult.

We have provisionally booked our current Year 6 on a residential trip in June 2022 and next years' Year 6 (current Year 5) in September 2022 (a letter will come out shortly). We are currently trying to book Year 4 a residential trip for April/May 2022 which is looking very promising (again information coming out shortly). We know our Year 5 missed out on their residential trip in Year 4 so we are currently booking something exciting and different for them in November this year (watch this space!).

## For all other year groups – the children will all be going on a day trip in the Autumn term!

Bear with us! We are really trying and battling against huge rising costs in the industry (due to price rises from their losses) to get you all the best possible prices and the children the best possible experiences.
