Happy New Year to all of our pupils, families and local community and welcome back for the Spring term!

This week started off with an Inset day where the whole staff team had a day of intensive training. This training was on Thrive. Thrive is a Social Emotional and Mental Health programme which we have bought in to as a school. The staff learnt about psychology of



emotional development, trauma informed responses and positive mental health strategies. The staff also looked how to screen and profile children so that we can ensure that all pupils are supported with their mental health and be given different levels of support, based on their amount or severity of need. Although we have all received the basic training, we have four members of our staff who have a much higher level of training and are Trained Thrive Practitioners. We hope programme this will dramatically improve our children's mental health and give our staff the tools to support the children with this.

I would like to welcome three members of staff to our team - Miss Gale - Year 3 Teacher, Mrs Welsey - Teaching Assistant in Year I and Miss Ede (returning to us!) - Teaching Assistant in Reception. Welcome to the team, I hope you will be really happy at RFPS, we are lucky to have you!

For those of you who have children who you would like to start with us in Reception in September (2024), please don't forget to apply for your child's school place as the deadline is Monday 15th January! Reception and KSI Disco - Thursday February 8th 2024





Safeguarding

If you are concerned that a child appears unhappy or is being abused act now using the contact numbers provided below. Contact the Warwickshire's Children and Families Front Door on 01926 414144. Lines are open Monday to Thursday 8am-5.30pm, Friday 8.30am- 5.00pm.

If you need to get in touch out of usual office hours, please contact the Emergency Duty Team immediately on 01926

If you think that a child is at immediate risk, contact the police immediately by dialling 999.

What will happen if I report child abuse?

Children are best cared for by their parents. Children are rarely

removed from their parents and most families are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk. If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.
