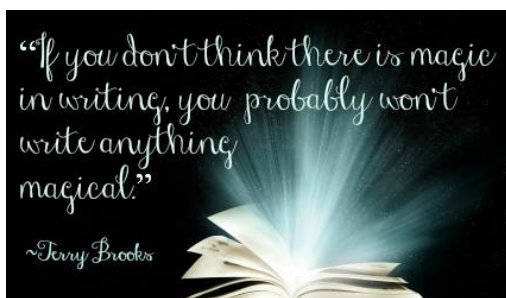

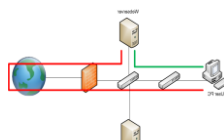

Summer One Year 6

Computing – Creating Media: 3D Modelling

Summer 1 will have year 6 introduced to the concept of 3D modelling by creating a range of 3D shapes; this will support the pupils with recognizing that you can work in three dimensions on a computer. We will create a 3D model for a given purpose after identifying that objects can be modified and combined in a 3D model. This will all lead to making our own digital 3D models.

In Maths, we will be focusing on SATs revision and applying the vast number of mathematics skills we have been learning to a wider range of problem solving and investigations.

Geography – South America

This term, we will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe regions of South America. We are going to be comparing areas in South America to areas in North America and thinking about the similarities and differences of these. We will be using grid references, contour lines and symbols in maps to understand and record the geography of South America. We will be learning some new Geographical Vocabulary such as latitude, longitude, equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, the Arctic and Antarctic Circles, the Prime (or Greenwich) Meridian and time zones (including day and night).

We'll use Atlases and technology to research key areas in South America and come up with some ideas about how resources are distributed and why, depending on the geography of the area.



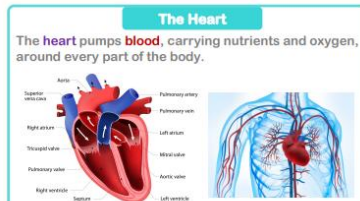
Music

In class we will be improvising and using phrases in our improvisations. We will be considering how pieces of music connect us to events or specific times in our lives and how they make us feel.

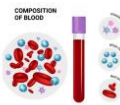
Science – Animals including Humans



The Heart

The **heart** pumps **blood**, carrying nutrients and oxygen, around every part of the body.

The red vessels are **arteries** and the blue vessels are **veins**. **Arteries** have thick, muscular walls and carry **oxygenated** blood from the heart to the rest of the body. **Veins** carry **deoxygenated** blood back to the heart and have thinner walls. **Capillaries** are microscopic vessels which link the veins and arteries together.



Red blood cells carry **oxygen**. **White blood cells** fight infection as part of the immune system. **Platelets** help to clot (thicken) the blood and form a scab. **Plasma** is the fluid part of the blood, which transports

Looking After Our Heart



To keep our **heart** and body healthy, we need to:

- eat a balanced diet (not too much sugar or fat);
- exercise regularly;
- drink approximately 2 litres of water a day;
- limit alcohol intake, in adults;
- get approximately 8 hours of sleep.



Drugs, including alcohol, can cause liver damage, poor sleep, high blood pressure, and different types of cancer. Drugs can be classified into four groups – painkillers, stimulants, depressants and hallucinogens.

Summer One Year 6

Spanish
