Message from Headteacher

Another slightly disrupted week for RFPS children, families and staff unfortunately. This delta variant of Covid19 has a lot to answer for and has meant further bubble closures for some of our pupils. However, those who are isolating are doing a fantastic job with their remote learning and we are impressed with the work that the children are producing.

We are still getting questions from parents whose children are self-isolating about what that actually means. **If you have received an email from school stating that your child is a close contact that means your child cannot leave the house for any reason except urgent medical care or a PCR test.** Unfortunately, we have had reports of children out walking and visiting each others houses etc when they are supposed to be isolating - **this is not allowed** and will be reported. This is not school being overly harsh but trying to keep the community as safe as possible.



Thank you for the lovely emails and messages of support. These mean so much to us at a time that has been difficult and stressful for all involved. I hope, whatever your situation, that you have a lovely weekend. Fingers crossed for a good result in the football on Saturday evening – we have a lot of very excitable children (and staff).

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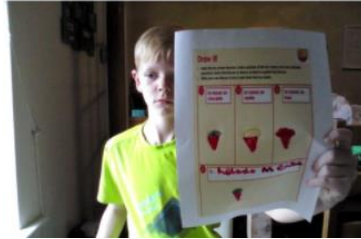
Year Four

Family Support

Message from Mrs Vural, Family and Children Support Worker:

Watching our children grow is such a rewarding experience and can give us so much to be grateful for. However, different stages in our child's development can bring with it many new challenges for parents. It can sometimes feel that we are the only parent struggling with how to support your child but that is never the case, and it is because so many parents are reaching out for extra support and advice that the Parenting Practitioners within Warwickshire have put together some fantastic virtual workshops. These offer support and advice in some of the most common situations that parents seek advice on including:

Routines and Boundaries - This two-hour workshop can help parents understand the importance of routines and boundaries for children. It will offer approaches that can be developed and implemented at home to reduce stress and help create a calm, relaxed home life.

Understanding Your Child's Behaviour – This parenting workshop focuses on understanding and improving your children's behaviour and provides positive parenting strategies to help you deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier family life.

Sleep Workshops - This two-hour interactive workshop for parents and carers looks at the importance of sleep, the science of sleep, possible causes of sleep issues and offers strategies to help.

Safe Home, Happy Home - This workshop will provide you with an opportunity to explore the possible safety risks that may exist in our homes and enable you to learn how you can keep your family home safe and comfortable for you and your children.
