Message from Headteacher

What a fabulous first week back we have had. The school has a real buzz of excitement and enthusiasm for this new academic year. It has been a very special week with having a completely full school for the first time in RFPS history! We now have Reception to Year 6 and 420 pupils! It is great to see the older pupils being excellent role models for our younger pupils and supporting them with understanding school life. Our new Reception cohort have had a few half days and come in on Monday, full time. They have all settled in brilliantly with the help of our amazing Reception staff team.

We have had many new staff members start with us and they have all settled in so well. Several of them have said what a kind, respectful atmosphere the school has, and how, although it is big, it has a real family feel. I love hearing things like that from people who have been in other work settings or other schools as it affirms what a special place RFPS is.

We have had a few confirmed Covid I9 cases amongst children and parents this week, which was inevitable. This hasn't led to bubble closures as the guidance has changed but if there is a positive case in your child's class you would have been advised to get a PCR test done. This is hopefully a much better system than isolating whole classes and year groups and much less disruptive for families and children's learning.

Start and End times

Can we remind you of the importance of having the children arrive on time each morning as it has a big impact on everyone if children are late. Also, please be respectful and adhere to the correct times to come in to the playground. We have to have slight staggered start and end times because of the amount of children we have at the school and our physical school space. Our times are as follows:

Reception and Year I will enter and leave school through the Reception playground and go in through their classroom door. **Start time is 8.40am – 8.50am** (you can drop your child anytime between these times but the gate will be locked just after 8.50am) and **finish time is 3.10am**.

Year 2 will enter in to the main playground and line up at 8.40am with their class teacher. They will be dismissed from their line at 3.10pm.

Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 (KS2) will enter on to the main playground and line up at 8.50am with their class teacher. KS2 pupils shouldn't be coming on to the playground before their start time unless they have a sibling at school that has already started earlier. Children in Year 3 should be supervised until it is time to line up. Year 4, 5 and 6 can be left unsupervised IF parents feel their child is responsible/sensible enough to be left unaccompanied. Year 3 and 4 will be dismissed at 3.15pm and Year 5 and 6 will be dismissed at 3.20pm.

We will keep the one way system because the gate in to school is narrow. You are welcome to speak to the class teacher and come in to the large playground before school but it needs to be quite a quick conversation as they will have the whole class to monitor. The school gates will be locked quite quickly once all the lines have gone inside so that the site it secure for the children.
