### **Traffic Incidents**

We wanted to raise some concerns regarding the traffic situation during both drop off and pick up times at our school.

We have observed cars being parked on the double yellow lines and double parking at the end of Central Park Drive. These parking issues not only pose a hazard to the safety of our children but also cause unnecessary congestion in the area. We kindly ask for your cooperation in finding alternative, safer parking spots or walking to school where possible. Furthermore, there has been at least one incident involving parents being verbally abusive towards each other in front of the children. We want to remind everyone of our school values of kindness and respect. Such aggressive behaviour is not tolerated in and around the school premises and undermines our efforts to create a positive and safe learning environment.



While we understand that these issues are complex, as a school, we are doing everything within our power to address them. We are in close communication with the local police and council to find long-term solutions. In the meantime, we kindly request that any specific incidents be reported directly to the police. We believe that by working together, we can create a safe and respectful environment for our children.



### Sickness and changes to pick up arrangements

Please can we remind you that if your child is ill, please contact the school office by 9am on each day that they will be absent. The school office is manned from 8.15am each morning, if you are unable to get through, please leave a voicemail. If your child is ill with vomiting and/or diarrhoea, the school's policy asks that your child does not return to school until 48 hours has passed since they last exhibited symptoms.

Please can we also ask that if your child has different pick-up arrangements to the usual; perhaps they are going home with a friend or you would like them to not go through to club or they have a GP or hospital appointment, that you please let the school office know before Ipm. We are getting several calls just before 3pm each day and we are not always able to get these messages to teachers on time. We would also appreciate that unless there are exceptional circumstances that you please book routine appointments such as dental check-ups outside of school time.

### **Safeguarding**

If you are concerned that a child appears unhappy or is being abused act now using the contact numbers provided below. Contact the **Warwickshire's Children and Families Front Door** on **01926 414144.** Lines are open Monday to Thursday 8am-5.30pm, Friday 8.30am-5.00pm.

If you need to get in touch out of usual office hours, please contact the Emergency Duty Team immediately on **01926 886922.** 

If you think that a child is at immediate risk, contact the police immediately by dialling **999.** 



### What will happen if I report child abuse?

Childcare agencies believe that children are best cared for by their parents. Children are rarely removed from their parents and most families are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk. If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.
