Frozen Kingdom in Y6

Year 6 have had a wonderful start to their "Frozen Kingdom" topic. We have been researching the geographical features of our planet's polar regions and creating fact files about The Arctic and Antarctica. We have compared the climates of both places and looked at how they are similar and different. In English, we have immersed ourselves in "Shackleton's Journey" and completed lots of writing in role as the crew members of Endurance on their Antarctic Expedition.



We were really exciting to find out that the start of us reading this book coincided with the 100th anniversary of Ernest Shackleton's mission setting sail. We have also explored the thoughts and feelings of the crew members through drama, conducting job interviews and performed motivational speeches to each other.

Science in Y4

Year four are studying states of matter in science. Our super scientists demonstrated great knowledge of properties of solids, liquids and gases to help them sort items. It was great to hear the reasoning and use of scientific knowledge for them to convince members of their group when they came across a tricky item. We started with 20ml of cream in a container. The children took it in turns to time one minute while another child vigorously shook the cream. There was a lot of shaking and dancing involved! After 3 minutes we noticed the cream had turned from a liquid.... into a solid! It was very interesting to learn about this chemical reaction. What a fun afternoon!

- Push & Glide and Swim 15m Front Crawl
- Push & Glide and Swim 15m Backstroke
- Swim 10m Breaststroke and 10m Dolphin Kick
 - Swim 25m continuously

BRONZE SURVIVAL SKILLS

- Enter the water using a compact jump (1.5m minimum depth), rotate to float on back for 75 seconds and tread water for 75 seconds shouting for help
- Perform a shout & signal rescue, a basic reach rescue from possible and explain what to do if they find a swimmer who requires help in open water

BRONZE MULTI-AQUATIC

- Perform a sitting dive (minimum depth 1.5m), a forward roll, a tread feet scull for 5m and a handstand


