
Road Safety

We appreciate it is extremely busy around school during drop off and collection times however, unfortunately we have already observed several incidents that put yourselves and your children at risk of serious injury. To avoid such an incident can we politely remind you of the following key points...



- Do not park on the double yellow or zig zag lines.
- Children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 MUST be escorted on to the playground and all child attending breakfast club (regardless of year group) MUST be signed in by an adult.
- Please cross at the crossing points. Several parents and children have been crossing on the corners which is extremely dangerous.
- Late children MUST be signed in at the office by an adult. Once the gate has closed there will be no staff outside to safeguard your child.
- Scooters and bikes MUST NOT be ridden on the playgrounds.
- If your child is making their own way into school, please ensure they do not arrive before 8:35am. On several occasions children have been outside school unaccompanied for a period of time

before the school gates open.

For Reception's Science learning this week, we have been thinking about the people in our family and how they are related to us. A huge thank you to all of our families who sent in photos; the children have enjoyed discussing and comparing their families with their friends and drawing a portrait of them. On Tuesday for World Languages Day, we also learned how to say Mother, Father, Brother and Sister in Spanish! In English we have been looking at the story On Every House on Every Street by Jess Hitchman, and comparing the houses which families live in. We have even learned how to sign the names of the different rooms in our houses - ask your child to show you!



World Languages Day celebrations 2023

On Tuesday this week, we celebrated World Languages Day at RFPS with children in each year group learning some words in another language, as well as finding out about the country where that language is spoken. In Reception, they learnt about Spain. Year I learnt some facts about Poland and how much snow they have there! Year 2 listened to the Three Little Pigs in Turkish and located Turkey on a map. Year 3 learnt how Punjabi is written with the help of Mrs Matharoo who speaks Punjabi. Year 4 learnt about samba dancing in Brazil and Carnival, then decorated their own carnival masks. Year 5 learnt some key phrases in Yoruba, learnt about the musical genre Afrobeats and performed a traditional welcome song and dance called 'Funga Alafia' from West Africa. Year 6 learnt some phrases in Latvian.

The children loved taking part in the 'hello in other languages treasure hunt' around the playground at break and lunch. It was fantastic to see their enthusiasm for learning words in other languages.

We will feature the achievements of pupils in the last newsletter of the month. Please share with us any achievements so that we can showcase how amazing our pupils are. We are very proud of them all!




Well done to Scarlett from Raccoons who achieved a pass mark of 85% in her street dance exam.




Half term holiday club - GAME ON

What will happen if I report child abuse?

Childcare agencies believe that children are best cared for by their parents. Children are rarely removed from their parents and most families



are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk.

If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.
