






Athletics Championship

If you need to get in touch out of usual office hours, please contact the <u>Emergency Duty Team</u> immediately on **01926 886922.**

If you think that a child is at immediate risk, contact the police immediately by dialling **999**.

What will happen if I report child abuse?

Childcare agencies believe that children are best

nost families are given help and support.
If after they have demonstrated that the air concerns the above members of staff

cared for by their parents. Children are rarely removed from their parents and most families are given help and support. Social Workers can only remove children from home with a court order and only after they have demonstrated that the child is at serious risk. If you would like to speak to someone in school about your concerns the above members of staff are Designated Safeguarding Leads and will be happy to listen to your concerns and take the appropriate steps to safeguard a child.
