English

Explore different characters in the text and describe their thoughts and feelings.

Make inferences on the basis of what is being said and done.

Make predictions based on what has happened in the story so far.

Write in role.

Write a set of instructions, a fact file and a story. Understand different points of view and explain.

Use expanded noun phrases to describe.

Answer questions based on what is written in the text.

Art and Design

To use drawing to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.

To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space. To learn about the work of a range of artists, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Music

To talk about what the song or piece of music means.

To know the type of song and instruments used. To know how to play certain notes on glockenspiel.

To respond to chanted rhythm patterns, including crotchets, quavers and crotchet rests.

Science

To explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.
