NSPCC "Speak Out, Stay Safe" Workshops

On Monday, children in Years 2, 5 and 6 took part in the NSPCC's Speak Out, Stay Safe workshops. This important programme helps equip pupils with the knowledge and confidence they need to stay

safe from abuse and neglect.



During the sessions, children learned about their right to feel safe, to speak out if something is worrying them, and to seek help from trusted adults. They also explored who they can talk to both in and out of school if they ever need support.

The workshops were engaging and empowering, helping our pupils understand that their voice matters and that there are always people ready to listen.

Reception - Autumn Walk



This week, the children in Giraffes and Zebras have been thinking about key features in the local area. On Tuesday, we went on a walk around Coton Park, putting into practise all we had learned on road safety earlier in the term. We spotted the building site, a bus stop, the supermarket, several road signs

and lots of our own houses. We also found some signs that winter is approaching. The children not only showed they were ready, respectful and safe at all times, but they also walked impressively quickly on their little legs, so they had time for a play in the park half-way around!

Miss Butters put in a letter of complaint to Glencar construction (the company building the very large warehouse at the top of Central Park Drive). The main essence of the complaint was:

The site manager apologised for any disruption that the build is causing and seemed surprised that we didn't know about the build/planning. They are also cleaning the road weekly but the site is particularly muddy at the moment. I did feel the site manager listened to our concerns and wanted to work with us. They are going to offer us some free educational visits once the site is almost completed in February.
