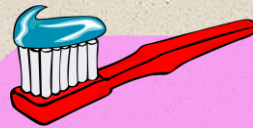


Our Core Areas of learning

We will be learning to...

Communication and language

- Listen attentively and respond to what they hear with relevant questions, comments and actions when being read to and during whole class discussions and small group interactions.
- Make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding.
- Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers

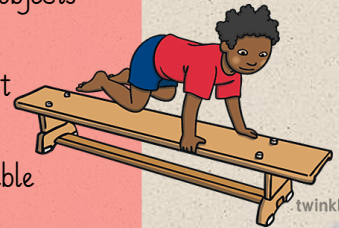


Personal Social and emotional development

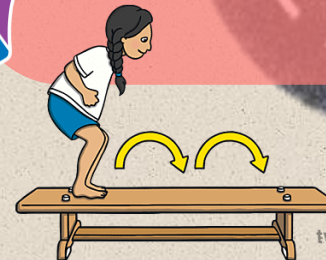
- Talk about things they find challenging and how to tackle them
- Set goals for themselves
- Use kind words to encourage others and themselves
- Understand how learning helps to get jobs in the future
- Understand what it means to feel proud

Physical Development

- Explore different ways of moving – slithering, crawling, hopping and jumping
- Practise balancing over objects and using one leg
- Use simple tools to effect change e.g. cutting
- Handle tools and malleable materials safely
- Form recognisable letters

Specific Areas of learning

The children will be learning to ...



Literacy

- Listen to books being read and able to recall information from them using new vocabulary
- Ask questions to find out more
- Recall what they have read
- Recognise rhyming words
- Apply phonics skills to blend CVC words together
- Begin to use finger spaces between words to break flow of speech into words
- Write captions to accompany pictures.

Mathematics

- Conceptually subitise within 5
- Subitise regular arrangements of 6 and 7
- Order numerals 1-5
- Explore ways to partition 5, and recall number bonds
- Represent 6 and 7
- Explore ways to make 6 and 7 using 5 and some more.
- Compare equal and unequal representations
- Use the language of heavy and light to compare mass
- Operate balance scales
- Explore and compare capacity.

Understanding the world

- Understand the people who help us and talk about members of our community, showing a positive attitude about the differences in people.
- Explore what some stories from different religions can teach us.
- Talk about the life of a person in history.
- Comment on similarities and differences from the past.
- Know what is the same and different about two places
- Observe and describe some properties of materials using simple language e.g heavy, light, hard, soft, bendy, magnetic
- Use tools to affect change on materials and observe how they change over time.
- Talk about objects and events and records through simple pictures/images.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Identify and explore artwork that uses printing
- Compare and contrast different artwork that uses printing, including that by Anni Albers
- Explore and practice printing skills using different materials
- Use printing skills to create a repeated pattern
- Use observational drawings to add details to final prints.
- Make props to support dramatic play
- Introduce a simple narrative to role play.
- Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs.
- Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others
- Try to move in time with music.
