This menu will go live on 1st June and is available to order via the Grow app.

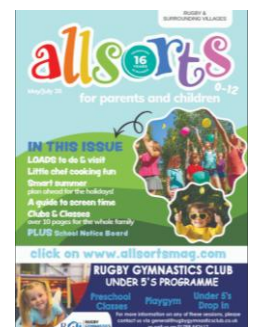
Please can we remind parents that you are able to order your child's lunch at home via the app and we do encourage you to do this. The daily cut off for ordering at home is 8.45am.
