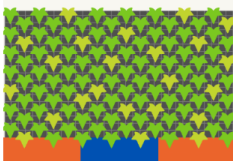
Focuses attention on air pollution.

## My Child At School (MCAS)



As we are nearing the end of the school year, please can we remind you to check yours and your child's MCAS to ensure all contact details we hold are correct.

If you have moved house please ensure you update yours and your child's address. This can be done via the app, each adult with MCAS will need to update their own details. You are also able to e-mail the school office with changes and we can update this for you.

## After School Clubs / Change to normal collection arrangements

Please can we remind you **if your child is not going to after school club that you let us know by 12pm at the very latest** to ensure that we are able to update the register. If you fail to inform us, then your child will need to be collected from the office and not the playground. This will ensure we are able to keep registers updated.

**If your child is going home with another child or a different, person who is not on the collection list please let the office know via e-mail with the person's name, address and contact number by 12pm on the day at the very latest.**

If worried about any child being a victim of neglect, abuse or cruelty whilst at RFPS, you must tell Miss Finch or, in her absence, one of her safeguarding team.

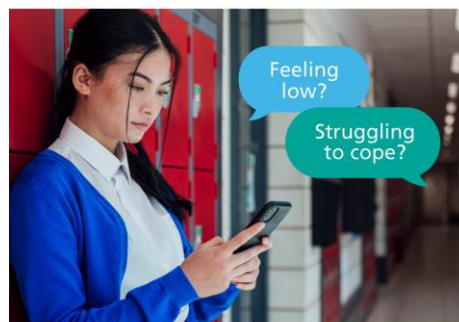
